### PATROL/09/08 General Progress and Service Standards

A report was submitted detailing progress in respect of (a) take up of civil parking enforcement powers in England (outside London) and Wales and information in relation to general progress and service standards.

The Joint Committee was informed of the Performance Indicators and given an analysis of the tables contained within the report. Reference was made to the period of time taken to dispose of cases and the reasons for this were outlined. The Chief Adjudicator outlined the procedure for telephone hearings, and in answer to a question confirmed that conference calls were recorded and digitally stored.

In response to a question the Joint Committee was informed that councils' IT suppliers were able to offer the facility to enable Councils to participate in Appeals on Line and Electronic Transfer of Evidence.

Reference was made to customer feedback and a user survey. Information in this respect will be presented to the Joint Committee in General Progress Reports.

Members agreed that it was appropriate for them to take back to their Councils the benefits of them participating in Appeals on Line.

#### Decision

1. To note the information concerning the current take up of civil enforcement of parking powers.

2. To note the performance contained in the report together with general progress information.

3. To note that a vigorous marketing campaign will be undertaken during 2009/2010 to persuade Councils to participate in Appeals on Line and Electronic Transfer of Evidence.

## PATROL/09/11 Final Revenue Accounts 2008/09

The Final Accounts for the year 2008/09 were submitted.

The Lead Officer responded to issues of detail highlighted by members. She agreed that more information would be provided when presenting the accounts for 2009/2010. Steps were being taken to control costs wherever possible. The increases were not just office based but also included venues for hearings.

Reference was made to the fact that the Tribunal now had a separate bank account from that of the Lead Authority and that further information on this would be submitted to the Executive Sub Committee in September.

The representative of the City Treasurer of the Lead Authority assured the Joint Committee that there were no problems envisaged in relation to Retirement Benefits.

#### Decision

2. To approve the 2008/09 Accounts for the Patrol Adjudication Joint Committee as prepared by the Lead Officer and detailed in the report including the Annual Governance Statement 2008/09.

4. To agree to balance the accounts by drawing £224,920 from the general reserves.

5. To note that the Auditor's report in relation to 2008/09 will be submitted to the PATROL Adjudication Joint Committee Executive Sub Committee in September 2009.

## PATROL/09/12 Service Charge 2009/2010

A report reviewing the charges levied from local authorities participating in the Joint Committee's adjudication service during 2009/2010 was submitted.

The Lead Officer introduced the report and outlined the options before the Joint Committee in relation to the Service Charges.

Some members present felt that further information was needed and that the charge should remain the same until the meeting of the Executive in January. Referring to the budget shortfall a member suggested that there should be further consideration of the matter by the Executive Sub Committee in January and that in the meantime the charge be increased to 65pence.

It was moved that the service charge be increased to 65 pence and reviewed again in January. The Chair put the motion to the Joint Committee and the proposal was carried.

#### Decision

2. To agree to levy service charges based on a quarterly in advance basis for the PCN charge based on estimated figures and subsequently adjusted.

3. To note that the decision to provide a transcription from the audio recording of proceedings rests with the Adjudicator. Where this has been agreed to, the Joint Committee agree that the incidental cost of making a transcription from the audio recording of proceedings at a personal hearing is charged to the requesting party except when, in the view of the Adjudicator, a disability of the requesting party would make it desirable for that person to receive such a transcript.

4. To request the Executive Sub Committee to review these charges at the meeting in January 2010.

A report was submitted relating to an offer of appointment by virtue of Regulation 17 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 and Regulation 9 of The Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Penalty Charge Notices, Enforcement and Adjudication) (Wales) Regulations 2008 to Caroline Sheppard, and to extend her appointment as Chief Adjudicator for England and Wales for the purposes of Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

## Decision

1. To approve the application of the Ministry of Justice Senior Salaries Review Board Group rate to the post of Chief Adjudicator with effect from 1 April 2009 as detailed in the report.

2. To approve the offer of an appointment as an adjudicator under Regulation 17 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (England) General Regulations 2007 and Regulation 9 of the Civil Enforcement of Parking Contraventions (Penalty Charge Notices, Enforcement and Adjudication) (Wales) Regulations 2008 to Caroline Sheppard who holds an existing appointment under Section 73 of the Road Traffic Act 1991 from the former National Parking Adjudication Service Joint Committee, the fresh appointment being subject to the consent of the Lord Chancellor.

3. To agree that when the Lord Chancellor's consent has been obtained, Caroline Sheppard be appointed as the Chief Adjudicator for England and Wales of the Traffic Penalty Tribunal, on the terms and conditions outlined in the report.
